

# **Vulnerable Adults and Elders at Risk of Abuse, Neglect or Exploitation**

**Call the Door County Senior Resource Center at 746-2542.**

If you are concerned about an adult of any age who you believe may have experienced, be experiencing or be at-risk-of experiencing some form of abuse or neglect, you are urged to report this concern.

◆ ***Physical Abuse:***

The intentional or reckless infliction of bodily harm on an individual

◆ ***Emotional Abuse:***

Intimidating, threatening, humiliating or otherwise harassing an individual for no legitimate purpose

◆ ***Sexual Abuse:***

The forcing of unwanted sexual activity onto an individual, by the use of threats, coercion or other means

◆ ***Financial Exploitation:***

Obtaining an individual's money or property through deceit or enticement or by forcing, compelling or coercing the individual against his/her will or without his/her consent

◆ ***Neglect:***

The failure of a caregiver to secure or maintain adequate care, services or supervision for an individual, including food, shelter, clothing, physical or mental health care, that creates significant risk or danger to the individual's physical or mental health

◆ ***Self Neglect:***

An individual's failure to take adequate care of self or home, including failing to obtain appropriate food, clothing, shelter, medical and dental care, that results in a significant danger to his/her physical or mental health

◆ ***Treatment without Consent:***

The administration of medication or the performance of psychosurgery, electroconvulsive therapy or experimental research on an individual who has not given informed consent

◆ ***Unreasonable Confinement or Restraint:***

The intentional confinement or separation of, use of physical restraints on, or provision of unnecessary or excessive medication to an individual

## **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE & BENEFIT COUNSELING**

- ◇ **Ministry Door County Medical Center Community Care** — The hospital provides community care for all services provided to the general public via the hospital (inpatient and outpatient) and Ministry Home Care (home health agency). Patient bills may be written off to charity care on the basis of the patient/family's annual income and assets.

- ◇ **Ministry Fund (also known as Katie's Fund)** — This program is used to pay for health & welfare related emergencies such as shelter, transportation, utilities, medications, outstanding dental bill, etc.

- ◇ **Brighter Day Fund** — The Brighter Day Fund is managed under the Ministry Fund. It is a fund specifically used to assist individuals that are suffering from some type of mental illness. Preferably referrals should come from providers, social workers, mental health workers. Some examples of assistance are rent, utilities, medications, DME.

- ◇ **Property Tax Deferral Loan, Wisconsin Housing & Economic Development Authority** — Eligible seniors may qualify for a loan to help pay property taxes with a lien then placed on the property. However, heirs will be responsible to pay back the loan upon the sale of the home. The application process is open from January 1st to June 30th.

- ◇ **St Joseph's Parish Emergency Fund** — This Christian service fund is designed to assist individuals in emergency situations.

- ◇ **Salvation Army** — Provides emergency funding to those in need of assistance for essential items such as rent or mortgage, shelter, utilities, food, and car repair. Other requests considered on a case-by-case basis.

- ◇ **Senior Tax Exchange Program (STEP)** — allows seniors 62 and older, whose primary residence are in the school District and who pay property tax, to work in the District in exchange for property tax credit. STEP participants receive \$7.25 per hour. A maximum of two eligible residents of the same property may share work to meet the \$565. amount for each primary residence, but combined pay cannot exc. \$565. This amount to a maximum of 78 work hours/household. **For Sturgeon Bay District, Call (920) 746-2801**
- ◇ **USDA Rural Development** — If you are already a rural homeowner and your house needs repairs, or modifications to make it accessible to a person with disability, you may be eligible for home improvement or repair assistance through USDA Rural Development. Rural Development provides Guaranteed Loans for low to moderate incomes to purchase a home, Repair and Rehabilitation Loans for very low income owner-occupied homes, and a Direct Loan Program for low incomes to purchase a home. - ◇ List of each person's allergies and any special needs; list may be obtained from doctor's offices
- ◇ Medical history of each individual
- ◇ Eyeglasses
- ◇ Hearing aids and batteries
- ◇ Name, landline and cell phone numbers of all doctors
- ◇ Names and phone numbers of all pharmacies used
- ◇ Financial information: bank accounts, credit card information, investments and retirement funds
- ◇ Checks and check-writing authority
- ◇ Financial Power of Attorney Directives and Medical Decision Making
- ◇ Insurance policies, home inventory and contact numbers of insurance agent or company

- ◆ Personal care items (denture cream, toothbrush, toothpaste, ointments, contact lens solution, chapped stick, deodorant)
