Money Donations to Museum

Donations in 2019 in the amount of \$14,570.26 included money put in the donation box by the 5,535 visitors who signed the guest book, money paid by groups for tours (Road Scholars and other adult, school, YMCA and other tour groups), and money given by individuals and businesses for photos purchased from our collection.

Accessions to the Museum Collection

See the attached "Collection List with Descriptions." This is the list of objects accessioned into the museum's collection during 2019. The items on this list may be, loaned or donated to another historical facility or de-accessioned as needed to manage the museum's collection. Notice that the list this year is more complete than in previous years, as each item has been listed rather than each accession (with multiple items in each accession donated by one person).

There would be Accessions from the Archives from 2019 that have not been put into the PastPerfect Museum Collections software as yet. The Archives at present is being staffed by 2 volunteers who have limited time to adequately enter the data into the program so they keep a list but haven't had the time to enter the data into the computer. There has also been trouble with the computer connection for much of the year which has also complicated the issue. The acquisition of the Younkers building and partnership with the library should allow for much better reporting on archives donations in the future.
