**Door County Criminal Justice Collaborating Council Committee (CJCC)**  
**Minutes of Meeting held Friday, September 14, 2018**

Judge David L. Weber called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m.

Present: Judge David L. Weber, Judge D. Todd Ehlers, Steve Vickman, Colleen Nordin, Dan Brinkman, Jennifer Moeller, Pat McCarty, Alyssa Liebergen, and Joe Krebsbach.

Motion by Steve Vickman, second by Judge Ehlers to adopt the agenda. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Steve Vickman, second by Dan Brinkman to approve minutes of meeting held July 13, 2018. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Judge Weber provided update on progress of “work group” – Weber, Liebergen, Nordin, and Krebsbach. Training grant expected to be submitted to the National Association of Drug Court Professional (NADCP) within 1-2 weeks.

Judge Weber led discussion of diversion program and how it could help with Treatment Court. Lt. Sternard obtained grant funds for the diversion program. Krebsbach made offer to person to administer the diversion program. Funds are in the 2019 budget for the administrator who will initially work on development of the diversion program. Krebsbach is working with the County Administrator Ken Pabich regarding other funding for the diversion program and Treatment Court.

The group continued discussion about the differences between the diversion program and Treatment Court, possible use of information gathered by administrator of diversion program for Treatment Court, grants in the future for Treatment Court, funding from the county, and information that needs to be gathered for discussions with Pabich and county officials.

The plan for Door County is a Treatment Court to handle, but not mix, some drug cases, higher level OWI, and mental health issues.

Report from McCarty regarding a Full-time computer analyst for the Sheriff’s Department and City Police: Chad Meilke. Judge Weber and Nordin updated group on pre-trial release options, bond alternatives and the Lock N Load kiosk at the jail. Moeller asked and Kresbach commented on realistic expectations for people in recovery and relapses. No other reports from judges, DA or Jail Administration.

The next meeting will be set by Judge Weber in October or November, depending on progress of items. Further discussion about visiting drug court in a nearby county or counties.

Motion by Judge Ehlers, second by Joe Krebsbach to adjourn. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
