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**Drive-Thru COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics Announced**

Wide-spread vaccination for COVID-19 is a critical tool to best protect everyone, especially those at highest risk, for severe illness and death. COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, *free*, and widely available. As we continue to see high case activity throughout the state, it's also important that we all add layers of protection, like getting vaccinated (including booster dose), wearing masks when indoors in public places, and staying home when feeling sick.

CDC now recommends that certain people are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 booster shot, including those who received Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson/Janssen COVID-19 vaccines. Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster. CDC's recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots.

For those who received Moderna or Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine, you are eligible for a booster *no sooner than 6 months* after receiving your second dose if you are:

- 65 or older
- Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
- Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
- Age 18+ who work or live-in high-risk settings

For Example: if you received your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna on May 14, you are eligible to receive your booster on or after November 14. <https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/covid-19/vaccine-dose.htm>

For those who received **Johnson & Johnson** COVID-19 vaccine and are aged 18 and older, a booster dose is recommended *no sooner than 2 full months* after receiving the first dose.

You may receive the Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine (age 12 and up-- 1<sup>st</sup> dose, 2<sup>nd</sup> dose or booster) or Johnson and Johnson vaccine (age 18 and up --1<sup>st</sup> or booster) at one of our drive-thru clinics scheduled at the Emergency Services Building located at 916 North 14<sup>th</sup> Ave. Sturgeon Bay on one of the following dates:

- **Wednesday, November 17, 2021 12:00pm – 5:30pm**
- **Thursday November 18, 2021 – 10:00am – 4:00pm**

**Appointments are required.** To schedule an appointment visit [bookdcph.timetap.com](https://bookdcph.timetap.com) or call Public Health at 920-746-7180 for assistance. Please note we will **NOT** have flu vaccine or vaccine for children age 5-11 available at these clinics.

To help expedite the process we ask that you do the following:

1. Wear short sleeves and have your arm readily accessible
2. **Print and complete consent forms ahead of time.** Forms can be found on our website at [Door County COVID-19 Situation Update | Door County, WI](#) Forms will be available at the site if not completed ahead of time.
3. ***Cloth Face coverings are required***

***Routine vaccination should be deferred for persons with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, regardless of symptoms, until criteria have been met for them to discontinue isolation.*** While mild illness is not a contraindication to vaccination, vaccination visits for these individuals should be postponed avoiding exposing healthcare personnel and other patients to the virus that causes COVID-19
